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

Parts	Description
Power/Lock key	 Press to turn the screen on/off Press and hold to popup menu to select Emergency, Power Off, or Restart Press it along with Volume Down key to capture screenshot Long press to force reboot
SIM/microSD card slot	Insert or remove SIM card/microSD card
Volume Up/Down	 Adjust volumes for calls, music, video and ringtones Press both Volume Up and Volume Down to enable/disable Accessibility features.
USB-C/Charger Port	Connect a USB cable (included) for charging, data transfer, or external accessories.
Front Camera	Take pictures or record videos while facing the screen.
Rear Camera	Take pictures or shoot videos. It is the main camera of the phone.
Microphone	Transmit your voice electronically to other party through this. Use while on a call, a voice recording or Google Assistant.
Speaker	Output the sound of calls, audio, or video
Proximity/Light Sensor	The Proximity Sensor locks the touchscreen when positioned near an object. The prevents fault operations during a call. The Light Sensor brightens or dims the touchscreen based on ambient light source.
Flash	Brighten the object for photoshoot at night.

CAUTION: Inserting an accessory into an incorrect jack may damage the phone.


Setting Up Your Phone

Your new phone should already have SIM card preinstalled.

If you purchase this phone without SIM card pre-installed, follow the steps below. The following steps also guide you to install your microSD card.

- Use the supplied SIM ejector tool to insert into the small hole on the SIM/ SD Card tray.
- 2. Pull the tray out and place your Nano SIM card and microSD card on the tray.
- Slide the tray attached with your Nano SIM card and microSD card all the way into the slot.

Caution: Your device only supports Nano SIM card. Do NOT use other types of SIM cards or else your device may be damaged.



Formatting or replacing microSD card

In the event that you need to format or replace microSD, first go to **Settings** --> **Storage**, and tap the Source to select **SD CARD**. Then tap at the top right corner to select **Format** or **Elect**.

To replace microSD card, select **Eject** and perform the same step how to open the SIM/SD Card tray to pull out the SIM/SD Card Tray and remove the card on the tray. Users may then place a new card.

Charging Your Phone

Your phone and battery are unibody device and the battery is unremovable. The battery can only be replaced by authorized technician. Do not attempt to disassemble the battery from the phone yourself; otherwise, it will void your warranty.

It is strongly advised to fully charge your phone when you unpack it. To charge your phone.

- Plug in the USB-C connector (the smaller end) of the USB charging cable into the USB-C port of your phone.
- Plug in the other end of the cable (the larger end) into an available USB port of the supplied AC adapter.
- 3. Plug the AC adapter into an available power outlet.
- When the phone is fully charged, disconnect the USB charging cable from the phone.




Caution: Do not charge your phone if the USB charging cable is wet. **Note:** Charging via a PC will take longer to charge your phone than charged via the provided AC power adapter.

You may also charge your phone by connecting to a PC or vehicle power charger.

To charge via a PC,

- 1. Make sure the PC is powered on.
- Plug in the USB-C connector (the smaller end) of the USB charging cable into the USB-C port of your phone
- Plug in the other end of the cable (the larger end) into an available USB port of PC.
- 4. When the phone is fully charged, disconnect the USB charging cable from the phone.


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Caution: Do not charge your phone if the USB-C port or the AC adapter is wet

To charge via a vehicle power charger in car,

- 1. Make sure the engine has been started already.
- 2. Prepare an in-car charging adapter (optional accessory) with available USB port(s) and connect with the vehicle power charger in your car.
- Plug in the USB-C connector (the smaller end) of the USB charging cable into the USB-C port of your phone
- Plug in the other end of the cable (the larger end) into an available USB port of the in-car charging adapter.
- When the phone is fully charged, disconnect the USB charging cable from the phone.



Caution:

- Do not charge your phone if the USB charging cable or the in-car charging adapter is wet.
- Do not connect your phone to the vehicle power charger when the car is being ignited. Your phone may be damaged by power surge.


Note:

Charging via an in-car vehicle power charger will take longer to charge your phone than charged via the provided AC power adapter.

Warning: Your wireless carrier is not liable for any damage resulted from any misconduct in charging your phone.

Long press the **Power Key** to power on your phone. You will see the starting-up screen.

Note: you may have to unlock the screen if you have set screen lock such as PIN or Face Key.



Emergency, Power off, Restart or Screenshot

To **power off or restart** your phone, press and hold the Power Key until options appear. The options are **Emergency**, **Power off** and **Restart**. Select the option you need for your device.

You may tap **Screenshot** to capture your current screen.



Starting Your Phone for The First Time

1. Once you have turned on and initialized your phone, tap $\overline{\ }$ to select your preferred language for your phone, then tap $\overline{\ }$.



2. From the **Phone Activation** screen, tap **Next** (assuming you have activated your SIM card as instructed in the **Welcome Guide**).



3. You will be prompted to connect to an available **Wi-Fi** network to setup. Enter password if required. If there is no available Wi-Fi network nearby, tap Set up offline.

Note: Users can only setup using WiFi after they satisfy the inital Verizon prepaid lock period.



4. To **Copy apps & data** from another device, tap **Next**, or tap **Don't copy** to continue. If you tap **Next**, follow the on-screen steps.



5. To **Sign in** with your Google[™] account, enter your account information and tap **Next**, or tap **Skip** to skip to the next step. If you sign in your Google[™] account, tap **I agree** to the **Google Terms and Services** shown on the screen.





Note: It is suggested to sign in or create your Google™ account here because the Google services on your phone, such as Google Play™ Store or Gmail™, require a Google™ account to access. You may sign in with your Gmail™ account if you already have one.

From the Google services screen, tap More and then Accept if you agree to the default selection of these Google services settings. You may turn on/ off the services later with the toggle switch.





7. Set **PIN** for screen lock, or tap **Skip** to continue.



8. Set your **Verizon Services**. Tap **ACCEPT** to use the default settings for the services.



9. Set your **Verizon Cloud**. Tap **NEXT** to enter **Verizon Cloud Setup**. Select what to backup and then tap **NEXT**.



10. Choose **Wi-Fi only** or **Both Wi-Fi and Mobile Networks** to back up your content on Verizon Cloud. You may change it anytime in Settings.



11. When you see Ready to go, tap GOT IT to complete the initial setup.



About Google account

Your device runs on Android[™] 12 operating system developed by Google[™]. A Google[™] account provides accesses to all the Google apps and services available for your device, including Gmail[™], Google Play[™], Google Maps[™], YouTube[™], Google Drive[™], Chrome[™], Google Photos[™], and more.

It is advised you sign in with your existing Google™ account, such as Gmail™ account, when you set up your phone for the first time.

If you do not have a Google™ account at this moment, you may set up a Google™ account through

- 1. Go to Settings --> Accounts
- 2. Tap + Add account --> Google
- 3. Follow the onscreen prompts on your device.

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Home Screen

Home Screen is where you start your operations with your new phone.



Items	Description
Status Bar & Notification	 Displays status of your phone and notifications. To view Notification Panel, swipe down from the Status Bar.
Quick-Access Apps Tray	 Quickly access the apps from Home Screen. Press and hold these apps to move or replace these apps.
Home Button	 From any application or setting, press it to return to Home Screen. Press and hold to turn on Google Assistant.
Back Button	Press to go back to the previous screen, close an option menu, or exit an operation.
Recent Button	 Press to display recently accessed applications, which are displayed in thumbnails. Tap on a specific thumbnail to enter a particular application. Swipe up a specific thumbnail to remove it from the screen. Tap CLEAR ALL to clear all the thumbnails on the screen.

Status Bar Icons

The icons in the Status Bar indicate status and notifications of your phone.

Using the Touchscreen

Tapping

Gently touch the touchscreen with your fingertip. A tapping action can:

- Open or select an item
- Check or uncheck an option
- Initiate on-screen keyboard



Tapping and Holding

Tap and hold on an item or a space of the touchscreen. A tapping and holding action can:


- Activate a menu
- · Activate a selection of items



Dragging

Hold onto an item and drag it. A dragging action can:


- · Move an item to a targeted position
- Create an app folder



Pinching & Spreading

Pinch and spread on the touchscreen with two fingers. A pinching/spreading action can


- Pinching --> zoom out
- Spreading --> zoom in




Swiping

Gently swipe on the touchscreen. A swiping action can:

- Scroll Up / Down on a page, a menu list or a screen.
- Scroll Left / Right to browse between extended screens.

Navigating the Home Screen

All the apps and features of your phone starts from the Home Screen. To access all your apps from the Home Screen, simply swipe up from the Home Screen and you will be able to view and access all your apps. You may swipe up and down to locate the app you want to access. The Home Screen can be customized to meet your needs or preferences.



Locking and unlocking the Home Screen

When your device is left idle from your last operation over a set period, the Home Screen begins to dim and eventually turns off in order to conserve battery power. The screen is then in an off and locked state.

- To turn on the screen, Press the Power key.
- To unlock the screen, Swipe up on the lock screen.

Note: If you have set PIN screen lock during the initial setup or other occasions, you will be required to enter the PIN to completely unlock the Home Screen.

 To lock the screen, Press the **Power key**.

Quick-Access Apps Tray

Quick-Access Apps Tray consists of basic functions of the phone, but may be customized by personal preference. You may perform the following actions for the Quick-Access Apps Tray.

- Reposition: touch and hold onto an app icon in the Quick-Access Apps
 Tray to move it to another position in the tray.
- Add: touch and hold onto an app icon somewhere on the Home Screen to drag it into the Quick-Access Apps Tray.
- Remove: touch and hold onto an app in the Quick-Access Apps Tray to move it out of the tray and to somewhere on the Home Screen.

Viewing extended screens

Swipe left or right to view extended screen(s). You may place new apps on the extended screens.

To add more extended screen(s), drag an app to the right edge of the screen and a new extended screen will be available. Then release the app and the new screen is added.

While on an extended screen, you may press **Home button** to return to the main Home Screen.






Opening the Quick Setting Panel

The Quick Setting Panel allows you to conveniently manage some commonly used setting options.

To access the Quick Setting Panel, swipe down twice from the top of the phone screen, and then swipe left or right to find the setting you need to turn on/off.

To turn on a setting, tap on the icon. To turn off, just tap it again.



Customizing your Quick Setting Panel

You may customize your Quick Setting Panel to meet your preferred usage. Simply tap the **Edit** icon and you will enter the Edit screen for the Quick Setting Panel.





In the Hold and drag to rearrange tiles,

Hold onto a shortcut icon in this tile and when you hear a light "click" vibration, you may start to drag it to rearrange the position of this icon in this tile.

In the Hold and drag to add tiles,


Hold onto a shortcut icon in this tile and when you hear a light "click" vibration, you may start to drag it to add into the **Hold and drag to rearrange tiles**.




Auto-rotate for viewing preference

The phone screen is oriented in portrait mode by default. You may turn on Auto-rotato to change the phone screen to landscape orientation for your viewing preference when you rotate your phone.

To enable **Auto-rotate**, swipe down from the top of the phone screen to display the Quick Setting Panel and gently tap on the Auto-rotate icon. To disable **Auto-rotate**, just tap on this icon again.






Accessing Apps from the Home Screen

You can access all your apps, whether pre-installed by default, transferred from your last phone or downloaded, from the Home Screen. Simply swipe up from the Home Screen and you will be able to view and access all your apps. You may swipe up and down to locate the app you want to access.

The Q Search apps bar on the top allows you to search apps by entering keywords.



Working with Apps

The following sub-sections will guide you how to work around with your apps.

To launch an app

- 1. From the Home Screen, swipe up to access all your apps.
- 2. Tap on the app icon to launch the app.



To move an app

- 1. From the Home Screen, swipe up to access all your apps.
- 2. Tap and hold onto the app you want to move.
- 3. You will feel a light "click" vibration, indicating you can start dragging the app.
- 4. Drag the app to your desired position.




- 1. Tap and hold onto the app you want to remove.
- 2. You will feel a light "click" vibration, indicating you can start dragging the app.
- 3. Drag the app to Remove or Uninstall.



To group the apps

- 1. Tap and hold onto the app you want to be grouped.
- 2. You will feel a light "click" vibration, indicating you can start dragging the app.
- 3. Drag the app to join the desired app.
- 4. They apps will form a group in a circle.
- 5. Tap the app group and you may edit the name for the app group.



Switching between the apps


To switch between recently opened apps,

- 1. Tap on the **Recent button** at the bottom right of the screen.
- 2. Swipe left or right to switch between recently opened apps.

Then.

- To access a recently opened app, tap onto the selected app.
 - To close a recently opened app, swipe it up.
- To close all the recently opened apps, swipe to the left end and tap CLEAR ALL.

Swipe it up to close






Recent Button

Capturing a Screenshot

You can capture the screen image. Press **Power key** and **Volume down** to capture a screenshot. The screenshot is automatically saved in Photos, or long press **Power Key**, wait for the **Screenshot** option to appear, then tap on it.



Notification Panel

Notifications like messages or downloads will appear in the Status Bar, which is at the top of the phone screen.

To check details of your notifications, swipe down from the top of the phone screen to open the Notification Panel. Then tap on a selected notification to check the details or status.

- To close the Notification Panel, swipe up on the screen or tap Back button .
- To manage notification history, tap History.
- · To clear all the notifications, tap Clear all.



Customizing the Home Screen

You may customize the Home Screen to meet your preference and usages. To display customization options, press onto anywhere on the Home Screen to enable an option menu which shows:

- · Home settings
- Widgets
- Wallpapers



Home settings

When tapping **Home settings**, you will see the following options:

- Notification dots (default is on): tap to access full settings for notifications
- Add app icons to Home screen (for new apps): if it is enabled, new app icons will be added to the Home Screen. Use the toggle switch to enable or disable this setting.
- Allow Home screen rotation (when phone is rotated): if it is enabled, the Home Screen will be rotated when the phone is rotated. Use the toggle switch to enable or disable this setting.



Notification dots

If you tap **Notification dots** in **Home settings**, you will see full setting options for **Notifications**, as shown in the screen below. Descriptions of the setting options are in the sub-sections as follows:



App settings

Manage notifications from individual apps. Use the toggle switch to enable or disable notifications from certain apps. Users may sort by MOST RECENT. MOST FREQUENT. ALL APPS. or TURNED OFF.



Notification history

Show recent and snoozed notifications. If you tap on it, you will be asked whether you want to **Use notification history**. Use the toggle switch to enable or disable this setting. When it is enabled, you will see recent notifications and snoozed notifications here.



Conversations

Only priority or modified conversations (e.g. messages) will appear here.

You may tap on available conversation(s) on the screen to set it as **Priority**, **Default**. or **Silent**.

Notes about marking a conversation as Priority:

- Open the message and tap : --> Details --> Notifications, and select Priority.
- Or
- Long-press the message from the Notification Panel and tap Priority.

Use the toggle switch to enable or disable the following:

- Pop on screen: when the screen is unlocked, notifications will appear as a banner across the top of the screen.
- Sound: set default notification sounds
- Show notification dot: if enabled, notification dot will appear
 - Vibration: vibration alert when receiving notification
- Not a conversation: remove the selected item from conversation







Bubbles

When it is on, conversations can appear as floating icons. If you tap on it, you will enter a sub-screen with option **Allow apps to show bubbles**. If it is on, some conversations will appear as floating icons on top of other apps. Use the toggle switch to enable or disable this feature.



Device & app notifications

This controls which apps and/or devices can read notifications.



Notification on lock screen

Set options for notification on lock screen.

- Show conversations, default, and silent: If this option is selected, the
 lock screen will show conversations, default, and silent notifications.
- Hide silent conversations and notifications: if this option is selected, silent conversations and notifications will hidden and not appear on the lock screen.
- Don't show any notifications: if this option is selected, no notifications will appear on the lock screen.



Do Not Disturb

When you tap Do Not Disturb, you can set your preferences for this feature. If you tap **TURN ON NOW** TURN ON NOW, you will only receive notifications from important people or apps. You may further set what can interrupt when **Do Not Disturb** is enabled

- People: set which Conversations, Calls (contacts or callers), or Messages can interrupt
- Apps: set which apps can interrupt. You may add or select certain apps that can interrupt when Do Not Disturb is on.
- Alarms & other interruptions: This option allows certain interruptions
 that make sound, like alarms and media, to interrupt when Do Not
 Disturb is turned on. The configurable interruptions include Alarms,
 Media sounds, Touch sounds, Reminders, or Calendar events.
- Schedules: This option allows you to set types of conditions that can interrupt when Do Not Disturb is turned on, for example, Sleeping and Event. You may tap + Add more to add more condition types, check the box to enable or tap on the setting icon at the right for further scheduling options.
- Duration for Quick Settings: select Until you turn off, For 1 hour +/-, or Ask every time
- Display options for hidden notifications: select No sound from notifications, No visuals or sound from notifications, or Custom (tap to see Custom Restrictions for details) when Do Not Disturb is turned on.



Wireless emergency alerts

Configure wireless emergency alerts.

Allow alerts: use the toggle switch to enable or disable it.

- Extreme threats: warns the users about extreme threats to life and property. Use the toggle switch to enable or disable it.
- Severe threats: warns the users about severe threats to life and property. Use the toggle switch to enable or disable it.
- AMBER alerts: receives alerts about child abduction emergency bulletins. Use the toggle switch to enable or disable it.
- Public safety message: receives recommended actions that can save lives or property. Use the toggle switch to enable or disable it.
- State and local tests: receives test messages from state and local authorities. Use the toggle switch to enable or disable it.
- Emergency alert history: tap to view emergency alert history.

Alert preferences

- Vibration: use the toggle switch to enable or disable vibration for alerts
- Alert reminder: tap to display a pop-up menu for alert reminder including Once, Every 2 minutes, Every 15 minutes or Never.
- Spanish: receive alert in Spanish if possible. Use the toggle switch to enable or disable it.



Hide silent notifications in status bar

If enabled, you will not see silent notifications in the Status Bar. Use the toggle switch to enable or disable it.

Allow notification snoozing

If enabled, notifications will be snoozed. Use the toggle switch to enable or disable it

Notification dot on app icon

If enabled, a small dot will appear on the app icon when the app has unread notifications. Use the toggle switch
to enable or disable it.

Enhanced notification

If enabled, you will receive suggested actions or replies towards notifications. Use the toggle switch to enable or disable it.




Widgets

When tapping Widgets, you can manage available Widgets of your phone. Widget functions like a shortcut of the app(s) on the Home Screen, and you can view the updated status of the app(s) directly on the Home Screen without locating and entering the app(s). For instance, a calendar widget allows you to see your calendar event on the Home Screen without entering the calendar app.

To add a widget on the Home Screen or extended screen, tap and gently hold onto the selected widget and move to your desired position.

To bring a widget to the Home Screen,

- Tap and hold onto the widget you want to move.
- 2. When you hear a light "click" vibration, you can start moving the widget.
- Drag the selected widget to your desired position on the Home Screen.



If you decide not to add the widget, simply drag the widget to Cancel.



To remove the widget,

- 1. Tap and hold onto the widget you want to remove.
- 2. When you hear a light "click" vibration, you can start moving the widget.
- 3. Drag the widget to Remove.

To setup the widget,

- 1. Tap and hold onto the widget you want to set.
- 2. When you hear a light "click" vibration, you can start moving the widget.
- 3. Drag the widget to Tap to finish setup.



Wallpapers

When tapping **Wallpapers**, you will enter the Wallpapers setting. The currently used wallpapers for Home screen and Lock screen are displayed at top. You may access **My photos**, **On-device wallpapers**, or other folders with compatible image files to be selected for wallpaper.

Note: you may have to allow the phone to access your media files during the first time you use Wallpapers.



When you select a wallpaper, you will see a preview by Home screen or Lock screen, and there are setting options:



- Set Wallpaper: tap ✓ to set the image as wallpaper for Home screen and/or Lock screen (refer to the image below).
- Zoom: tap ⁿ to allow you to zoom in/out the image.
- Info: tap (i) to view info of the photo. You will first see the name of the provider of the photo, and you may tap Explore to view further information of the photo provider.
- Exit Wallpaper: tap X to exit wallpaper.




Note: if you are using the Wallpapers feature for the first time, you may be asked to allow access to the storage of your phone, like internal memory or SD card (the microSD card you inserted during the initial setup)

Text Input on Gboard

Your phone comes with the touch-screen keyboard (Gboard) to enter texts. The touch-screen keyboard appears automatically when you are on a text entry field of the apps that requires text input, such as search bar, text messages, instant messaging and social network apps. You may enable Autorotate to change the orientation of the touch-screen keyboard, for instance, from portrait to landscape orientation.

Note: Below is a sample image for entering texts. The layout of text input may vary depending on the app you are using.

Touch-screen keyboard (Gboard)



Useful text input features

Predictive texts

Predictive texts make typing easier by suggesting the words based on the letters you have entered.



Quick-editing

Tap and hold onto the text you want to edit.

Drag the tabs at the beginning and/or the end of the highlighted texts to adjust the highlighted portion, and options such as **Copy**, **Cut**, **Paste**, **Select All**, **Share** or **Translate**.





One-handed mode

Tap to enable One-handed mode. Use or to align the keyboard to the left or right respectively.

To exit One-handed mode, tap 🔯 or 💠





Theme

Select the theme for your keyboard. You will see a preview before you apply.





Clipboard

Clipboard saves any text you copy. Use r to pin, add or delete clips.

Note: you may have to tap to enable this function when you use Clipboard for the first time.



Settings

Tap **t** to display the settings.



Languages

Language allows you to set your Gboard languages and layouts.

Tap on the language and the layout on the screen, and you will enter a subscreen with more keyboard layout options, including

 QWERTY (default), Handwriting, QWERTZ, AZERTY, Dvorak, Colemak, PC or Morse Code.

Tap **ADD KEYBOARD** to add an additional set of language and layout to your touch-screen keyboard. You may take advantage of the search bar Q at the top right corner of the screen to find your preferred language.







Preferences

Enter **Preferences** to set preference for your Gboard.

Keys

- Number row: always shows number row in QWERTY, QWERTZ, and AZERTY layouts. Use the toggle switch to enable or disable it.
- Show emoji switch key: shows a dedicated key to access emoji. When
 enabled, the language switch key will not be shown. Use the toggle
 switch
 to enable or disable it.

Layout

- One-handed mode: tap to select Off, Right-handed mode, or Left-handed mode.
- Keyboard height: tap to set Extra-short, Short, Mid-short, Normal, Midtall, Tall or Extra-tall.

Keypress

- Sound on keypress: use the toggle switch to enable or disable sound on key press.
- Volume on keypress: system default
- Haptic feedback on keypress: Use the toggle switch to enable or disable haptic feedback on key press.
- Vibration strength on kepress: system default

- Popup on keypress: use the toggle switch to enable or disable popup on keypress.
- Long press for symbols: long press keys to acess hinted symbols. Use the toggle switch to enable or disable it.
- Key long press delay: tap to use a slider to set time for long press delay (default is 300ms).





Theme

See Theme in Menu.

Text correction

Enter **Text correction** to set text correction preferences.

Suggestions

- Show suggestion strip: displays suggestion strip while typing. Use the togqle switch to enable or disable it.
- Next-word suggestion: uses previous words in making suggestions.
 Use the toggle switch to enable or disable it.
- Block offensive words: if enabled, offensive words will be censored with *asterisks. Use the toggle switch to enable or disable it.
- Suggest Contacts: uses information from Contacts for suggestions. To enable this function, you have to allow Gboard to access your contacts.
 Use the toggle switch to enable or disable it.

Corrections

- Auto-correction: corrects words while typing. Use the toggle switch to enable or disable it.
- Undo auto-correct on backspace: returns to original text when backspacing after an auto-correction. Use the toggle switch to enable or disable it.
- Autospace after punctuation: inserts space after punctuation (only available in US English keyboard setting). Use the toggle switch to enable or disable it.
- Auto-capitalization: capitalizes the first word of each sentence automatically. Use the toggle switch to enable or disable it.
- Double-space period: double taps on spacebar to insert a period followed by a space. Use the toggle switch to enable or disable it.

Spelling and Grammar

- Spell check: marks misspelled words with red underlines while typing.
 Use the toggle switch to enable or disable it.
- Grammar check: marks grammatical errors with blue underlines while typing. Use the toggle switch to enable or disable it.





Glide typing

Sets Glide typing preferences.

- Enable glide typing: inputs a word by sliding through the letters. Use the toggle switch to enable or disable it.
- Show gesture trail: if enabled, a swipe on the keyboard will create a line showing the trail. Use the toggle switch to enable or disable gesture trail.
- Enable gesture delete: deletes words by sliding left from the delete key.
 Use the toggle switch to enable or disable gesture trail.
- Enable gesture cursor control: moves cursor by sliding across space bar. Use the toggle switch to enable or disable gesture trail.



Voice typing

Sets voice typing preferences.

 Use voice typing: use the toggle switch to enable or disable voice typing.



Clipboard

Displays options for clipboard settings.

- Show recently copied text and images in suggestions bar: use the toggle switch to enable or disable it.
- Show items such as address/phone number within recently copied text: use the toggle switch to enable or disable it.
- Save recent screenshot in clipboard: use the toggle switch to enable or disable it



Dictionary

Enter **Dictionary** to create your personal dictionary.

- 1. Tap Personal dictionary.
- 2. Tap on the language on the screen, for example, English (US).
- Use the + icon on the top right corner of the screen to add a new word in your phone dictionary.
- 4. Type your word and type in the **Shorcut** for your phone to recognize.
- 5. Tap the **Back arrow <-** to complete.







Emoji, Stickers & GIFs

Enter **Emoji**, **Stickers & GIFs** to set your preferences for emoji, stickers and GIFs.

Lavout

- Emoji fast-access row: shows popular and frequently used emojis on the main keyboard. Use the toggle switch to enable or disable it.
- Emojis in symbols keyboard: shows a row of recently used emojis in the symbols keyboard. Use the toggle switch to enable or disable it.
- Emoji with the physical keyboard: physical Alt key shows the emoji keyboard. Use the toggle switch to enable or disable it.

Suggestions

- Predictive content search: suggests content to browse (GIF, Emoji, Sticker). Use the toggle switch to enable or disable it.
- Suggestions while typing: shows content on the suggestion strip
 Emoji: use the toggle switch to enable or disable it.

 Stickers: use the toggle switch to enable or disable it.
- Emoji stickers: suggests stickers when you select emojis in the emoji keyboard. Use the toggle switch to enable or disable it.



Share Gboard

See Share Gboard in Menu.

Advanced

Enter Advanced to access advanced setting options.

- Share usage statistics: automatically sends keyboard usage statistics to Google. Use the toggle switch to enable or disable it.
- Show app icon: displays application icon in the launcher. Use the toggle switch to enable or disable it.

Learning

- Personalization: adapts Gboard to your typing and voice typing usage patterns. Use the toggle switch to enable or disable it.
- Improve voice and typing for everyone: Gboard makes model improvement on devices based on usage pattern. If enabled, it indicates your permission for Gboard to use these improvements in an aggregated approach, to update Google's voice and typing services.
 Use the toggle switch to enable or disable it.

Learn more


Delete learned words and data: clears all on-device data that Gboard
has saved to improve your typing and voice typing experience. If you tap
on it, a Note dialogue box will appear and remind you that the learned
words will be erased and this operation cannot be undone. If you wish to
proceed, you have to enter the numbers displayed in the dialogue box.



Rate us

When you tap on it, you will be asked the question Are you enjoying Gboard?

- If you tap Yes, you will be redirected to Play Store to give your rating.
- If you tap No, you will be redirected to an email page requesting you to send your feedback.



Voice input

The voice typing function is based on Google's speech recognition technology. Tap Voice typing \P to initiate. Start what you want to say when you see the message "Speak now". What you say will be input as texts in the text-entry field. When the phone is analyzing your voice input, it will show "Listening...".



Notes:

- Make sure your device is connected to a network in order to activate this function.
- 2. Speak as clearly as possible.
- This function might not be available in certain service areas, and some languages may not be supported in certain service areas.

Google Assistant

Google Assistant is an Al-empowered voice assistant that allows you to execute commands, open on-device apps, or activate functions by speaking to your device. If Google Assistant is unavailable in your service areas, or is unable to meet your requests, you will be directed to Google search.

To use Google Assistant,


- Press and hold onto the Home button .
- 2. Once activated, speak to Google Assistant about your request. Remeber to speak clearly.





Adjusting Volumes

When using any functions or apps that requires user voices or generates volumes, such as Google Assistant, music, or YouTube, always adjust volume to appropriate levels in order to protect your hearing and avoid disturbing others.

Checking Data Service Signal

Assuming you have SIM card installed in your phone, as described in **Setting Up Your Phone**, and activate it the way described in the **Welcome Guide**, your phone should automatically connect to mobile data service as your SIM card should be pre-activated by your cellular service providers.

It is strongly suggested that you perform the following actions to check if you have connected to mobile data service.

- Swipe down twice to open Quick Setting Panel, and see if the Mobile Data icon is enabled, or go to Settings --> Network & internet --> Mobile network to see if the toggle switch of Mobile data is turned on. Information of your cellular service provider and current mobile data usage is also shown here.
- Next. make a phone call.
- 3. Then, open your browser and visit a website.

Option: turn on the toggle switch of Roaming if needed.





Note: If you find some problem in any of the steps above, contact your carrier's customer services immediately for help regarding your SIM card activation.

Checking Wi-Fi Connection

If there is any accessible Wi-Fi hotspot or AP (access point) around where you are using the phone, connect to the Wi-Fi for secure and reliable network and enter the password if required.

It is strongly suggested that you perform the following actions to check if you have connected to a Wi-Fi network.

- Swipe down twice to open Quick Setting Panel, and see if the Wi-Fi icon is enabled, or go to Settings --> Network & internet --> Wi-Fi to see if the toggle switch of Use Wi-Fi is turned on. You may also tap the setting icon next to the Wi-Fi network you have connected to view further details including signal strength, frequency and security.
- 2. Then, open a browser and visit a website.
- 3. Send a message or call a contact through an instant messaging app.









Note: if your phone is connected to both mobile data network and Wi-Fi network, the phone will prioritize Wi-Fi network over cellular network by default to save on usage of your data plan.

Hotspot and Tethering

The Hotspot and Tethering setting allows you to share mobile data connection with other nearby devices. You may create a portable, personal hotspot with this phone through

- Wi-Fi hotspot
- USB tethering
 - Bluetooth tethering
- Ethernet tethering (requires additional accessories such as USB OTG adapter and USB-to-Ethernet adapter)





Wi-Fi hotspot

You can turn your phone into a Wi-Fi mobile hotspot to share your mobile data connection with nearby device(s). To enable mobile Wi-Fi hotspot on your phone,

- Go to Settings --> Network & internet --> Hotspot & tethering --> Wi-Fi hotspot.
- 2. Use the toggle switch to enable or disable it.
- 3. To edit the hotspot name, tap **Hotspot name** to display a text entry field to enter a new hotspot name.
- To set security, tap Security to display options of WPA3-Personal, WPA2/WPA3-Personal, WPA2-Personal or None.
- To set password, tap **Hotspot password** to display a password entry field.

Other setting options:

- Turn off hotspot automatically: automatically turns hotspot off when
 no devices are connected. Use the toggle switch to enable or
 disable it.
- Extend compatibility: helps other devices find this hotspot. However, it will reduce hotspot connection speed. Use the toggle switch to enable or disable it.
- Connected Devices List: shows the list of connected devices.





USB tethering

Use USB tethering to share the phone's mobile data connection with other devices, such as laptops and desktop computers, through USB connections.

To use this function, you must have first established USB connection with a laptop or desktop computer. Then use the toggle switch to enable or disable it.

Note: if you enable this function, you cannot transfer data between the phone's internal storage and the laptop or desktop computer.



Bluetooth tethering

Use Bluetooth tethering to share the phone's mobile data connection with other nearby Bluetooth device(s) through Bluetooth connections. Use the toggle switch to enable or disable it.

Notes:

- Make sure your phone and nearby devices have been paired through Bluetooth.
- The tethering will turn off if the Bluetooth of either your phone or the other device is turned off.
- For details about Bluetooth pairing, refer to Pair new device.



Ethernet tethering

To enable this function, you need additional accessories such as USB OTG adapter and USB-to-Ethernet adapter in order to establish Ethernet (LAN) connections for your phone.



Connecting to VPN

This phone can connect to virtual private network (VPN) that enables you to connect to services or resources inside a secured private network from a public network. VPN is commonly deployed by large corporations and educational institutes for security purposes. If you want to connect to the VPN of your office or school on this phone,

- 1. Go to Settings --> Network & internet --> VPN
- 2. Tap on the + icon at the top right corner.
- For details about how to fill in VPN profiles show in the image below, contact the IT administrators or managers of your office or school.



Bluetooth

You can use Bluetooth to share and transfer files wirelessly within the designated range specified by Bluetooth specifications.

Note: Before using Bluetooth to send and receive files, it is recommended to read the safety cautions about Bluetooth in the **Important Notes about Bluetooth and Wi-Fi** section in the **Safety and Compliance** chapter.

Turning Bluetooth on

There are two ways to turn your Bluetooth on: via Quick Setting Panel or



Using the Quick Setting Panel:

- Swipe down twice from the top of your screen to open the Quick Setting Panel.
- 2. Find the Bluetooth tab.
- 3. Tap it to turn on.



Using the Settings



1. Swipe up from your screen to access all apps and find the Settings



Tap Settings --> Connected devices --> Connection preferences -->
Bluetooth --> use the toggle switch to enable Use Bluetooth.



Pairing with another Bluetooth device

If your Bluetooth is on,

- 1. Tap Settings --> Connected devices --> + Pair new device.
- 2. Wait for searching available devices.
- Select the device you want to pair with (it is strongly recommended to pair with the device that you recognize and trust).
- 4. Wait a moment for the pairing process.
- 5. When the Bluetooth pairing code appears, tap Pair.

Sharing with paired Bluetooth device

You can send files directly to the paired device. To do so,

- 1. Tap on the file you want to send to the paired device.
- 2. Tap on Share icon
- 3. Select Bluetooth *
- Select the paired device.

Notes about Bluetooth:


- Pairing and sharing through Bluetooth shall be performed at a secured location or trusted surroundings.
- 2. For details about supported Bluetooth profiles, see Appendix.

USB

You can use USB to transfer files with a connected device. Use the supplied USB Type-C cable to connect with the device you want to transfer files. For proper connection, plug in the USB Type-C end of the cable into the USB Type-C port of your phone (follow the same instruction in **Charging Your Phone** section), and plug the other end (the larger end) of the cable into an available USB port of the other device, such as a PC.

Transferring files via USB

Once you have properly connected your phone with another device through USB cable, the following message will pop up. Tap **OK** to allow file transfer through USB connection.



OR

Tap Settings --> Connected devices --> USB --> File Transfer to start transfering files through USB connection.



Android Auto™

Your phone comes with Android Auto™ to mirror features of your phone on your car's display unit, such as dashboard information and/or infotainment head unit. Once the pairing between your phone and the car's display unit, you can mirror the apps of your phone onto the car's display. Most supported applications are related to GPS mapping, navigations, music playback, telephone and voice commands.

To pair your phone with your car for the first time,

- Tap Settings --> Connected devices --> Connection preferences -->
 Android Auto.
- 2. Touch + CONNECT A CAR + CONNECT A CAR
- Connect the supplied USB cable between your phone and your car's Android Auto - compatible USB port.
 OR

Tap Connect using wireless Android Auto --> Connect using Bluetooth (make sure your car has the voice command button that supports Android Auto).







Notes:

- Make sure your vehicle supports Android Auto. If you wish to know whether your vehicle is compatible with Android Auto, refer to the Android Auto official website or contact your car's dealership.
- If you need help, go to Connection help --> HELP CENTER.
- Android Auto is a trademark of Google LLC.

Tap the Phone app \(\sqrt{\text{s}}\) from the Home Screen to make a call. You may make a call with any of the following options:

- Tap a saved contact in Contacts
 Tap a recent call log in Recents
 - Tap a favorite contact in Favorites
- Use voice search function to find the contact





Dialing and Ending a Call

The Dial pad allows you to manually enter the number you want to dial. Then tap .

Tap the Delete icon 🛽 to erase digits if you make a mistake.

*Hold onto the 1 key on the pad to enter voicemail.



To hang up a call, tap 🔼

International call

To make an international call, hold onto the 0 key to input +, and then enter the required country code, area code and/or mobile code followed by the phone number. Then tap to dial.

Note: additional charges may apply.

Emergency call

If you are making a call within cellular network coverage, enter the emergency number in your area and tap . Keep in mind that emergency call does not require a SIM card and PIN code.

During a call

During a call, you may use the Volume key on the side of your phone to adjust the volume, and use the following functional icons on the screen

Answering and declining incoming call

When receiving an incoming call, a incoming call window with caller ID appears on the top of the screen.

To answer the call

Tap ANSWER on the call window to answer the call.

To decline the call

Tap DECLINE on the call window to reject the call.

Tap on the incoming call window to open it as full screen. On the full screen,

- Tap or swipe up on the screen to answer the call.

All incoming calls are recorded in Recents Recents

Voice search

Tap \P to initiate voice dialing to search your contacts. Remember to pronounce the name of your contact as clearly as possible.

Contacts

Tap contact list sorted by predefined orders and find the contact you want to call.



Creating new contact

Tap ** Create new contact to add new contact number(s). Then, you will be prompted to fill out the required fields, such as name, phone numbers, or emails. Tap **SAVE** once you have filled out the contact information.

Tap ${\bf Saving}\ {\bf to}$ to save your newly created contact as ${\bf Phone}\ {\bf contact}$ or ${\bf Google}\ {\bf contact}.$





Calling a contact

To make a call from a saved contact, tap the contact you want to call. Then tap on the phone icon $\$ beside the contact's number.



Sending message to a contact

If you want to send a message to a contact, then tap on the message icon

beside the contact's number. You will be redirected to a message

composing screen.



Contact editing

You may tap the edit icon 🖊 to edit information of the selected contact.





Contact setting

To make some setting for a selected contact, tap to display setting options:

- Link: this option allows you to set a contact to link with the selected contact.
- Delete: delete the contact from the Contact list. You will see a dialogue box asking if you want to delete this contact.
- Share: share your contact as a vcf. through Nearby device, Bluetooth, email. cloud drive. message or instant messaging apps.
- Create shortcut: the selected contact will become a widget to be on your Home screen. Touch and hold it to move it to the Home Screen or just tap ADD TO HOME SCREEN to bring the selected contact to your Home screen.
 - **Set ringtone**: select a ringtone from the list for the selected contact.
- Refresh: refresh the contact information if there is any update.



Adding Contact to Favorites

Tap on the **star icon** ☆ to add the selected contact to Favorite.




Recents

Tap On the country to display recent call logs (call history). To make a call from a recent call log, tap next to the contact's phone number.




If you tap on a call log, you may

- Create new contact: store contact as Phone contact or Google contact. Refer to Create new contact in Contacts
- Add to a contact: redirected to Contacts contact.
- Send a message: enter the text message screen to compose your message
- Block number: block this number
- Call details: displays call history of this number.



Send a message

Tap **Send a message** to enter a message composing screen.



Block number

Tap **Block number** to block the selected number and you will no longer receive calls from this number.



Call details

Tap **Call details** to view details (such as date and time) and status (such as outgoing call, incoming call or replied call).



Favorites

Tap to display your favorite contacts.

If you have not placed any of your contact as Favorites, you may tap **ADD A FAVORITE**. Then you may select a saved contact from your Contact list. Once you selected a contact, tap on the **star icon** \bigstar to complete and this selected contact will appear on FAVORITE.







Call Settings

Tap: to display Call history and Settings.



Call history

Call history is sorted by ALL, MISSED, INCOMING, and OUTGOING call logs. To clear call history, tap : and then Clear call history.





Settings

Tap **Settings** to access all the setting options for phone calls.



Display options

Display options allows you to sort your contacts by First name or Last name, as well as the Name format by First name first or Last name first.



Sounds and vibration

You can adjust the Media volume, Call volume, Ring & notification volume, and Alarm volume

You may also set the following features:

- Do Not Disturb: enter Do Not Disturb setting.
- Phone ringtone: select a ringtone from the pop-up list
- Media: sets media player options
 - **Pin media player**: to quickly resume playback, media player stays open in Quick Setting Panel. Use the toggle switch to enable or disable it.
 - Show media recommendation -- shows media recommendation based on your activity. Use the toggle switch to enable or disable it
- Vibrate for calls: sets vibration options for phone calls, including Never vibrate, Always vibrate or Vibrate first then ring gradually.
- Default notification sound: selects a notification sound from the popup list.
- Default alarm sound: selects an alarm sound from the pop-up list.
- Dial pad tones: use the toggle switch to enable or disable sounds when tapping on the Dial pad.
- Screen locking sound: use the toggle switch to enable or disable the sound during screen locking.
- Charging sounds and vibrations: use the toggle switch to enable
 or disable sounds and vibration when charging.
- Touch sounds: use the toggle switch to enable or disable touch sounds.
- Touch vibration: use the toggle switch to enable or disable the haptic feedback for tap, keyboard, and more.



Quick responses

You can edit the quick responses that can be used to decline an incoming call by sending a selected response to the caller. The sample image below shows the default responses and you may edit them to meet your needs.



When receiving an incoming call at an inconvenient situation to answer the call, tap
on the screen and you will see these quick responses.



Calls

This option allows you to access call settings.

- Wi-Fi calling: tap to set Wi-Fi calling preferences. Use the toggle switch to enable or disable Wi-Fi calling. If enabled, you can further set Update Current Emergency Address and When Roaming. The former allows you to set the address to be used by emergecy services when you make an emergency call over Wi-Fi from this phone within the U.S. The latter allows you to choose which connection (Wi-Fi or Cellular) you prefer while outside your wireless network
- Turn on video calling: use the toggle switch to enable or disable video calling.



Blocked numbers

Use this feature to block calls from unidentified callers. Use the toggle switch to enable or disable it. If enabled, you won't receive calls or texts from blocked numbers.

To start, tap $\boldsymbol{\mathsf{Add}}$ a $\boldsymbol{\mathsf{number}}$ and enter the phone number in the pop-up

 $number\hbox{-entry-field}.$



Voicemail

You can use this setting to initialize your voicemail if you cannot activate your voicemail by pressing the 1 key on the dial pad.

- Notifications: tap to access the full setting menu for your voicemail notifications.
- Visual voicemail: use the toggle switch to activate or deactivate visual voicemail.
- Advanced Settings: set options for service provider and voicemail number.



Notifications

Tap ${\bf Notifications}$ on the last screen to enter the full setting menu. You may choose ${\bf Default}$ or ${\bf Silent}$ style.

Default

May ring or vibrate based on your phone settings.

- Pop on screen: when the device is unlocked, notifications will be displayed as banners across the top of the screen. Use the toggle switch to enable or disable it.
- Sound: tap to display a list of notification sounds
 - Vibration: use the toggle switch to enable or disable vibration for notifications
- Show notification dot: if enabled, a small dot will appear to indicate notifications. Use the toggle switch to enable or disable it.

Advanced setting

Service: displays service carrier.

Setup: tap to enter a voicemail number.



Accessibility

The Accessibility menu provides useful tools for users to easily interact with the phone.

- TTY mode: tap to display a list of TTY Off, TTY Full, TTY HCO (Hearing Carry Over), and TTY VCO (Voice Carry Over).
- Hearing aids: enabling this feature to turn on hearing aid compatibility.
 Use the toggle switch to enable or disable it.
- Real-time text (RTT) call: allows messaging within a voice call. Use the toggle switch to enable or disable it.
 - RTT provides assistance to callers who are deaf, hard of hearing, have a speech disability, or need more than voice alone. In addition, RTT calls are saved as a message transcript and RTT is not available for video calls.
- Noise reduction: enabling this feature to suppress your background noise during calls. Use the toggle switch to enable or disable it.

- Build version: displays build version number.
- Open source licenses: tap to view license details for open source software
- Privacy policy: tap to view the entire Privacy Policy by Google.
- Terms of Services: tap to view the entire Terms of Services by Google.


This phone enables you to import or export your contacts.

To import or export contacts

- 1. Tap on **Contacts** app from the Home Screen (if you don't have
- Contacts app on the Home Screen, swipe up from the Home Screen to access all your apps and tap on Contacts).
- 2. Tap = at the top left corner of the screen
- Tap Settings.
- 4. Select Import or Export.



- Import: If you tap Import, you may select import contacts from .vcf file, SIM card, phone storage or other compatible accounts.

Taking Special Shots

Panorama mode



Play Store

Play™ Store is the official app store for Android™ devices. Just sign in or set up your Google™ account to browse and download millions of apps published through Google™, such as games, music, comics, books, videos, learning tools and more. Some apps may require extra charges.

- Choose network: displays the carrier name of the mobile data network.
- Access Point Names: tap to view or select the APNs of your mobile data network



Airplane mode

From the **Network & internet** screen, use the toggle switch **to** enable **Airplane mode** to meet the aviation safety regulation when you are boarding an airplane.



Wi-Fi Calling

From the $\bf Network~\&$ internet screen, tap $\bf Wi\text{-}Fi~Calling$ to enable or disable Wi-Fi calling and its features

 Wi-Fi Calling: use Wi-Fi to make a call when the mobile network is not available. Use the toggle switch to enable or diable it.

When Wi-Fi Calling is enabled, you may further configure **Update Current Emergency Address** and **When Roaming**.



Hotspot & tethering

From the Network & internet screen, tap on Hotspot & tethering.

The Hotspot and Tethering setting allows you to share mobile data connection with other nearby devices. You may create a portable, personal hotspot with this phone through

- Wi-Fi hotspot
- USB tethering
- Bluetooth tethering
- Ethernet tethering (requires additional accessories such as USB OTG adapter and USB-to-Ethernet adapter)



Wi-Fi hotspot

To enable mobile Wi-Fi hotspot on your phone,

- From the Hotspot & tethering screen, tap Wi-Fi hotspot.
- Use the toggle switch to enable or disable it.
- 3. To edit the hotspot name, tap **Hotspot name** to display a text entry field to enter a new hotspot name.
- To set security, tap Security to display options of WPA3-Personal, WPA2/WPA3-Personal, WPA2-Personal or None.
- To set password, tap Hotspot password to display a password entry field

Other setting options:

- Turn off hotspot automatically: automatically turn hotspot off when no devices are connected.
- Extend compatibility: helps other devices find this hotspot. However, it will reduce hotspot connection speed.
- Connected Device List: displays the list of devices connected to your Wi-Fi hotspot.



USB tethering

To use this function, you must have first established USB connection with a laptop or desktop computer. Then use the toggle switch to enable or disable it.

Note: if you enable this function, you cannot transfer data between the phone's internal storage and the laptop or desktop computer.



Bluetooth tethering

Use Bluetooth tethering to share the phone's mobile data connection with other nearby Bluetooth device(s) through Bluetooth connections. Use the toggle switch to enable or disable it.

Notes:

- Make sure your phone and nearby devices have been paired through Bluetooth.
- The tethering will turn off if the Bluetooth of either your phone or the other device is turned off.
- · For details about Bluetooth pairing, refer to Pair new device.



Ethernet tethering

To enable this function, you need additional accessories such as USB OTG adapter and USB-to-Ethernet adapter in order to establish Ethernet (LAN) connections for your phone.



Data Saver

From the **Network & internet** screen, tap on **Data Saver**. Use the toggle switch to enable or disable **Use Data Saver**.

Data Saver helps reduce data usage by preventing some apps from sending or receiving data in the background. You may also tap Unrestricted data to select certain apps to use unrestricted data even when Data Saver is on.



VPN

If you want to connect to the VPN of your office or school on this phone,

- From the Network & internet screen, tap VPN.
- 2. Tap on the + icon at the top right corner.
- For details about how to fill in VPN profiles show in the image below, contact the IT administrators or managers of your office or school.



Mobile Plan

From the **Network & internet** screen, tap on **Mobile plan** to view the information about your data plan.

Private DNS

From the **Network & internet** screen, tap on **Private DNS** to set private DNS modes:

- Off
- Automatic
- Private DNS provider hostname (must enter hostname of the DNS provider)



Connected devices

From the Settings screen, tap Connected devices to configure

connection preferences with connected devices.

Note about ψ USB: you have to connect your phone with another device via USB connection to use this feature.



Pair new device

- 1 From the Connected devices screen, tap Pair new device to scan and pair a Bluetooth device.
- Wait for the phone to scan nearby Bluetooth devices. 2
- Select a device to pair (it should be the device that you know and trust). 3
- 4 Wait a moment for the pairing process.
- When the Bluetooth pairing code appears, tap Pair. 5

Optional: you may tap Device name to change the default device name of your phone to be visible by other Bluetooth devices.



USB

From the Connected devices screen, tap USB to set USB preferences (your phone must connect to a device via USB to set this option).

You may set USB controlled by

- Connected device
- This device (your phone)

Set USB used for

- File Transfer
- **USB** tethering
- MIDI
- PTP
- System updates No data transfer (charging only)



Connection preferences

From the **Connected devices** screen, tap **Connection preferences** to set preferences with peripheral devices.



Bluetooth

From the **Connection preferences** screen, tap **Bluetooth** to enter preference setting for Bluetooth.

- Use the toggle switch to enable or disable Use Bluetooth.
- Tap Device name to change your device name to be visible by other Bluetooth devices.
- Tap Pair new device to pair with a nearby Bluetooth device. See the Pair new device section for steps.



Cast

From the **Connection preferences** screen, tap **Cast** to cast the contents of your phone onto a TV, display device, or sound system with Google Cast capability, for example, a display installed with Chrome Cast

- Connect your phone to the same Wi-Fi network as your TV, display device, or sound system.
- 2. Tap on a device on the Cast screen to connect with your phone.



To cast your phone contents onto the connected device, operate the connected devices as recommended by its user guide.

Printing

From the **Connection preferences** screen, tap **Printing** to set printing service on your phone.

To set up printing service on your phone,

- Make sure your **Default Print Service** is on. If it is off, tap Default Print Service to enter and use the toggle switch to enable or disable Use print service.
- Make sure your phone connects to the same Wi-Fi network as your printer.
- Turn on your printer and connect it to the same Wi-Fi network.
- When your printer appears on the **Printing** screen, you can start printing with your printer from your phone.
- You may tap + Add service to add a printer app to configure printing service on your phone. For details, refer to the instruction of the specific app you download.





Files received via Bluetooth

From the **Connection preferences** screen, tap **Files received via Bluetooth** to view and open the files received through Bluetooth.



Chromebook

From the **Connection preferences** screen, tap **Chromebook** to set connections with a Chromebook device.

Connecting your phone to Chromebook allows you to send/receive text, synchronize chat notifications, share files, and share mobile data conection with your Chromebook. You may also unlook your Chromebook with your phone.

Nearby Share

From the **Connection preferences** screen, tap **Nearby Share** to set Nearby Share preferences.

Use Nearby Share: use the toggle switch to enable or disable **Use Nearby Share**.

Account & device

- Account name: displays your Google account name. Tap to choose or add an account.
- Device name: displays the default device name to be visible by your nearby contacts.
- Device visibility: tap to set device visibility to your contacts. You may set your device visible to everyone, selected contacts or hide some contacts.
- Data: tap to set data usage. You may select to use Data (charges may apply), Wi-Fi only, or Without internet (shared offline) as the sharing channel

To pair your phone with your car for the first time,

- Tap Settings --> Connected devices --> Connection preferences -->
 Android Auto.

- Storage & Cache: view the app size, user data, cache and total storage spaces used for this app. You may use MANAGE SPACE MANAGE SPACE OR CLEAR CACHE CLEAR CACHE to optimize your memory bandwidth.
- Mobile data & Wi-Fi: view the Total, Foreground and Background data usage ofr this app during a preset time period. You may also use the toggle switch to enable or disable Background data (enable mobile data use in the background) or Unrestricted data usage (allow unrestricted data use when Data Saver is on).
- unrestricted data use when Data Saver is on).

 Screen time: tap to view or set the screen time for this app. From the Screen time screen, tap

 by Screen time, Notifications received, or Times opened. Tap

 to view the time usage of this app by Hourly or Daily. You may also set timer, manage notifications or view sites related to the Digital Wellbeing of this app.

- Battery: manage your battery usage of this app. You may set Unrestricted, Optimized, or Restricted.
- Open by default: allows app to open supported links.

Unused apps

 Remove permissions and free up space: use the toggle switch to enable or disable this function to optimize performance.

Store

App details: tap to see details of the installed app on Google Play Store.

Default apps

From the Apps screen, tap Default apps to view your default apps.

You may tap **Opening links** to open links in apps, even if they are not installed on your phone.





Instant apps

Instant apps: if enabled, links will be opened in apps even if you don't have the apps installed. Use the toggle switch to enable or disable it.

Instant Apps preferences: tap to enable or disable Upgrade web links provided by Google Play Instant.

Installed apps

Select an app to set whether you want to enable or disable **Open supported links** with the toggle switch . When enabled, you allow web links to open in apps. The image below shows an example.



Screen time

From the **Apps** screen, tap **Screen time** to view screen time information dashboard.

Ttap Screentime • to view the time usage of this app by Screen time, Notifications received, or Times opened.



Unused apps

From the Apps screen, tap Unused apps to the list of unused apps.

Special app access

From the **Apps** screen, tap **Special app access** to set special access types for your apps. Select the special access type and set the related apps.



Notifications


From the Settings screen, tap Notifications to see full setting options

for **Notifications**, as shown in the screen below. Descriptions of the setting options are in the sub-sections as follows:



App settings

Manage notifications from individual apps. Use the toggle switch
one enable or disable notifications from certain apps. Users may sort by MOST RECENT, MOST FREQUENT, ALL APPS, or TURNED OFF.



Notification history

Show recent and snoozed notifications. If you tap on it, you will be asked whether you want to **Use notification history**. Use the toggle switch to enable or disable this setting. When it is enabled, you will see recent notifications and snoozed notifications here.



Conversations

Only priority or modified conversations (e.g. messages) will appear here.

You may tap on available conversation(s) on the screen to set it as **Priority**, **Default**. or **Silent**.

Notes about marking a conversation as Priority:

- Open the message and tap : --> Details --> Notifications, and select Priority.
 - Or
- Long-press the message from the Notification Panel and tap Priority.

Use the toggle switch to enable or disable the following:

- Pop on screen: when the screen is unlocked, notifications will appear as a banner across the top of the screen.
- Sound: set default notification sounds
- Show notification dot: if enabled, notification dot will appear
- Vibration: vibration alert when receiving notification
- Not a conversation: remove the selected item from conversation







Bubbles

When it is on, conversations can appear as floating icons. If you tap on it, you will enter a sub-screen with option **Allow apps to show bubbles**. If it is on, some conversations will appear as floating icons on top of other apps. Use the toggle switch
to enable or disable this feature.

Device & app notifications

This controls which apps and/or devices can read notifications.





Notification on lock screen

From the **Notifications** screen, tap Notification on lock screen to set options for notification on lock screen.

- Show conversations, default, and silent: If this option is selected, the lock screen will show conversations, default, and silent notifications.
- Hide silent conversations and notifications: if this option is selected, silent conversations and notifications will hidden and not appear on the lock screen.
- Don't show any notifications: if this option is selected, no notifications will appear on the lock screen.



Do Not Disturb

When you tap Do Not Disturb, you can set your preferences for this feature. If you tap **TURN ON NOW** TURN ON NOW, you will only receive notifications from important people or apps. You may further set what can interrupt when **Do Not Disturb** is enabled.

- People: set which Conversations, Calls (contacts or callers), or Messages can interrupt
- Apps: set which apps can interrupt. You may add or select certain apps that can interrupt when Do Not Disturb is on.
- Alarms & other interruptions: This option allows certain interruptions
 that make sound, like alarms and media, to interrupt when Do Not
 Disturb is turned on. The configurable interruptions include Alarms,
 Media sounds, Touch sounds, Reminders, or Calendar events.

- Schedules: This option allows you to set types of conditions that can interrupt when Do Not Disturb is turned on, for example, Sleeping and Event. You may tap + Add more to add more condition types, check the box to enable or tap on the setting icon at the right for further scheduling options.
- Duration for Quick Settings: select Until you turn off, For 1 hour +/-, or Ask every time
- Display options for hidden notifications: select No sound from notifications, No visuals or sound from notifications, or Custom (tap to see Custom Restrictions for details) when Do Not Disturb is turned on.



People

From **Do Not Disturb** screen, tap **People** to set onversations, Calls (including contacts and callers), or Messages that can interrupt when **Do Not Disturb** is turned on.



Apps

From **Do Not Disturb** screen, tap **Apps** to set the preferred apps that can interrupt when **Do Not Disturb** is turned on. Users may add and select the apps that can interrupt.



Alarms & other interruptions

From **Do Not Disturb** screen, tap **Alarms & other interruptions** to enable or disable interruptions that make sounds when **Do Not Disturb** is turned on. The configurable interruptions include:

- Alarms
- Media sounds (sounds from video, games or other multimedia types)
- Touch sounds (sounds from keyboad or buttons)
- Reminders
- Calendar events

Use the toggle switch to enable or disable these settings.



Schedule

This option allows you to set types of conditions that can interrupt when Do Not Disturb is turned on, for example, **Sleeping** and **Event**. You may tap + to add more condition types, check the box \square to enable or tap on the setting icon at the right \mathfrak{S} for further scheduling options.



When tapping (for Sleeping

- Use schedule: use the toggle switch ____ to enable or disable it
- Edit edit a schedule name
- Days: tap to display days of a week and check boxes of the days you prefer
- Start time: tap to display a clock and set the start time
- End time: tap to display a clock and set the end time
- Alarm can override end time: when this is enabled, the scheduled will turn off once an alarm rings. Use the toggle switch to enable or disable it
- Do Not Disturb behavior: tap to use default setting or create custom setting for this schedule with options of Calls, Messages, Alarms, Media sounds, Touch sounds, Reminders, Calendar options, and Display options for hidden notifications.



When tapping (i) for Event

- Use schedule: use the toggle switch to enable or disable schedule for Event
- Edit : edit a schedule name
- Delete
 delete "Event" rule
- During events for: select "Any calendar" or "PC sync"
- Where reply is: select "Yes, Maybe, or Not replied", "Yes or Maybe", or "Yes"
- Do Not Disturb behavior: tap to use default setting or create custom setting for this schedule with options of Calls, Messages, Alarms, Media sounds, Touch sounds, Reminders, Calendar options, and Display options for hidden notifications.



You may also tap + Add more to add more schedules.

Wireless emergency alerts

Configure wireless emergency alerts.

Allow alerts: use the toggle switch to enable or disable it.

Alerts

- Extreme threats: warns the users about extreme threats to life and property. Use the toggle switch to enable or disable it.
- Severe threats: warns the users about severe threats to life and property. Use the toggle switch to enable or disable it.
- AMBER alerts: receives alerts about child abduction emergency bulletins. Use the toggle switch to enable or disable it.
- **Public safety message**: receives recommended actions that can save lives or property. Use the toggle switch to enable or disable it.
- State and local tests: receives test messages from state and local authorities. Use the toggle switch to enable or disable it.
- Emergency alert history: tap to view emergency alert history.

Alert preferences

- Vibration: use the toggle switch to enable or disable vibration for alerts
- Alert reminder: tap to display a pop-up menu for alert reminder including Once, Every 2 minutes, Every 15 minutes or Never.
- Spanish: receive alert in Spanish if possible. Use the toggle switch to enable or disable it.



Hide silent notifications in status bar

If enabled, you will not see silent notifications in the Status Bar. Use the toggle switch to enable or disable it.

Allow notification snoozing

If enabled, notifications will be snoozed. Use the toggle switch to enable or disable it.

Notification dot on app icon

If enabled, a small dot will appear on the app icon when the app has unread notifications. Use the toggle switch (to enable or disable it.

Enhanced notification

If enabled, you will receive suggested actions or replies towards notifications. Use the toggle switch (to enable or disable it.



Battery

From the **Settings** screen, tap **Battery** to view battery usage and manage your battery use.



Battery Usage

From the **Battery** screen, tap **Battery Usage** to view battery usage since last full charge in graphical presentation. You can also view the apps that consume power by percentage.



Battery Saver

From the **Battery** screen, tap **Battery Saver** to set preferences for Battery Saver

- Use Battery Saver: use the toggle switch to enable or disable
 Use Battery Saver.
- Set a schedule: tap to select No schedule or Based on percentage.
 If the latter is selected, you may set the percentage of the remaining battery to start Battery Saver mode for your phone.
- Turn off when charged: if enabled, Battery Saver will turn off when your is charged. Use the toggle switch to enable or disable it.



Battery Manager

From the Battery screen, tap Battery Manager to manager your battery.

Use Battery Manager: if enabled, apps that drain the battery will be detected. Use the toggle switch to enable or disable Use Battery Manager.

 Restricted apps: tap to view which apps are restricted to limit battery usage.



Battery percentage

From the **Battery** screen, use the toggle switch to enable or disable **Battery percentage**. If enabled, the remaining battery percentage will appear in the status bar.

Storage

From the **Settings** screen, tap **Storage** to view and manage your storage.

You may use the following options to manage your storage:

- Tap THIS DEVICE or SD CARD to view and manage the phone's internal storage or the microSD card installed respectively.
- Use the toggle switch to enable or disable Storage manager to help free up storage space by removing backed up photos and videos from your device. You may tap on Storage manager to use the toggle switch to enable or disable Use Storage manager and tap Remove photos & videos to set 30, 60, or 90days to remove backed up photos and videos.
- Tap Files app
 to manage and free up storage space.
- Tap on different file types such as Apps, Games, Videos, Images,
 Documents, Trash or Audio to manage a specific item. For example, if
 you go to Apps or Games and select an app, you will be able to view the
 storage used by this app and choose to CLEAR STORAGE

Sound

From the **Settings** screen, tap **Sound** to manage sounds for media, call

or notifications.

Use the slider to adjust volume for Media volume, Call volume, Ring & notification volume and Alarm voluem.

- Do Not Disturb: refer to Do Not Disturb under Notifications in Settings.
- Phone ringtone: tap to select your preferred ringtone from the pop-up list.
- Media: tap to set Pin media player (media player stays open in Quick Settings) and Show media recommendations (based on your activity).
 Use the toggle switch to enable or disable the functions.
- Vibrate for calls: tap to select Never vibrate, Always vibrate, or Vibrate first then ring gradually.
- Default notification sound: tap to select your preferred notification sound from the pop-up list.
- Default alarm sound: tap to select your preferred alarm sound from the pop-up list.
- Dial pad tones: use the toggle switch to enable or disable dial pad tones.
- pad tones.
 Screen locking sound: use the toggle switch to enable or

disable screen locking sound.

- Charging sounds and vibration: use the toggle switch to enable or disable sounds and vibrations when your phone is being charged.
- Touch sounds: use the toggle switch to enable or disable touch sounds
- Touch vibration: use the toggle switch to enable or disable haptic feedback for tap, keyboard, and other activities.



Display

From the **Settings** screen, tap **Display** to adust display parameters for your phone.



Brightness level

From the **Display** screen, tap **Brightness level** to use the slider bar on the top of the screen to adjust the brightness level of your phone.



Dark theme

From the **Display** screen, use the toggle switch to enable or disable **Dark theme**, which uses a black background to help reduce power consumption on some screens.

Tap on Brightness level to access detailed adjustments for Dark theme.

- Use the toggle switch to enable or disable Use Dark theme.
- Tap on Schedule to set Dark theme schedule, and the options include None, Turns on at custom time, or Turns on from sunset to sunrise.





Night Light

From the **Display** screen, use the toggle switch **to** enable or disable **Night Light**, which tints the screen amber, ideal for reading in dim light. Tap on **Night Light** to access detailed adjustments for Night Light.

- Use the toggle switch to enable or disable Use Night Light. If enabled, you may use the Intensity slider to adjust your intensity.
- Tap on Schedule to set Dark theme schedule, and the options include None. Turns on at custom time. or Turns on from sunset to sunrise.





Adaptive brightness

From the **Display** screen, tap **Adaptive brightness** to use the toggle switch to enable or disable **Use adaptive brightness**. If enabled, the screen brightness will automatically adjust to your surroundings or activities.





Wallpaper

From the Display screen, tap Wallpaper to access your wallpaper or image

folders.





Screen timeout

From the **Display** screen, tap **Screen timeout** to set the time for screen timeout.





Auto-rotate screen

From the **Display** screen, tap **Advanced** and use the toggle switch **Auto-rotate screen**



From the **Display** screen, tap **Advanced** and tap **Font size** to adjust your preferred font size. The screen features a nearly full page sample text and a slider near the bottom to adjust your font size. When you use the slider to adjust your font size, the sample text on the screen will change accordingly for your preview.



Display size

From the **Display** screen, tap

Advanced and tap **Display size** to adjust your preferred display size. The screen features a sample instant-messaging image and a slider at the bottom to adjust the display size for your phone. Whenever you use the slider to adjust the display size, the sample instant messaging image will change its size accordingly for your preview.



Screen saver

From the **Display** screen, tap <u>v</u> **Advanced** and tap **Screen saver** to set your screen saver.

- Use the toggle switch to enable or disable Use screen saver.
- Tap the Setting icon beside Current screen saver to set the style
 (Digital or Analog) or enable Night mode.
- Tap When to start to select While charging, While docked, While charging or docked, or Never.



Lock screen

From the **Display** screen, tap <u>Advanced</u> and tap **Lock screen** to manage your lock screen.

What to show

- Privacy: tap to choose Show all notification content or Don't show notification content.
- Add text on lock screen: tap to enter text for your lock screen.
- Show wallet: set a screen lock in order to enable it.
- Show device control: set a screen lock in order to enable it.

When to show

 Wake screen for notifications: if enabled, when the screen dark, it will turn on for new notifications. Use the toggle switch to enable or disable it.



Wallpaper

From the Settings screen, tap Wallpaper to access wallpaper or image

folders. Refer to **Wallpapers** in **Basic Operations** about how to set wallpaper for your phone once you have accessed the wallpaper or image folders.

Accessibility

From the **Settings** screen, tap **Accessibility** to use the features designed for improved accessibility usage.



Accessibility Menu

From the **Accessibility** screen, tap **Accessibility Menu** to open the accessibility menu. The Accessibility Menu is a large, on-screen menu to control and navigate your phone.



Accessibility Menu shortcut: when using the toggle switch to enable Accessibility Menu shortcut, a pop-up message will appear with some introductions and ask for your permission to allow it to have full control of your device. Tap ALLOW to enable or tap DENY to not enable it.



- Settings: tap on Settings to access Accessibility Menu Settings.
- Large buttons: if enabled, the size of Accessbility Menu Buttons will increase. Use the toggle switch to enable or disable it.
- Help & feedback: tap to be redirected to the Support site of Google.

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Select to Speak

From the **Accessibility** screen, tap **Select to Speak** to use this accessibility feature. If enabled, you may select items on your screen, like texts or images, to hear them read or described aloud.

Select to Speak shortcut: when using the toggle switch to enable Select to Speak shortcut, a pop-up message will appear with some introductions and ask for your permission to allow it to have full control of your device. Tap ALLOW to enable or tap DENY to not enable it.





Select to Speak Settings

From the **Select to Speak** screen, tap **Settings** to enable or disable further options.

- Text to speech settings: tap to set Preferred engine (Google Text-to-Speech), language, speech rate or pitch. You may press PLAY or RESET for simulation.
 - Read in background: if enabled, Select-to-Speak will continue reading even when you move to other screens or apps. Use the toggle switch to enable or disable it.
- Read text on images: if enabled, tap on text within photos of the camera viewfinder to hear the text read aloud. Use the toggle switch to enable or disable it.
- Help & feedback: tap to be redirected to the Support site of Google.



Switch Access

From the **Accessibility** screen, tap **Switch Access** to use this accessibility feature. Switch Access allows you to select, scroll, or type on your phone through one or more switches, such as external switches, keyboard, or hardware buttons, instead of the touchscreen. Switch Access can be helpful if you can't interact directly with your device. When enabled, Switch Access will run its default auto-scanning through items on your screen in turn until you make a selection.



Use Switch Access: when using the toggle switch to enable Use Switch Access, a pop-up message will appear with some introductions and ask for your permission to allow it to have full control of your device. Tap **ALLOW** to enable or tap **DENY** to not enable it.

Switch Access shortcut: when using the toggle switch to enable Use Switch Access, a pop-up message will appear with some introductions and ask for your permission to allow it to have full control of your device. Tap ALLOW to enable or tap DENY to not enable it.



Switch Access Settings

From the **Switch Access** screen, tap **Settings** to enable or disable further options.

Help

- Help & feedback: tap to be redirected to the Support site of Google.
- Open setup guide: tap to choose a switch type: USB, Bluetooth or Camera.

Camera Switch

Camera Switch settings: tap to enable/disable Use Camera Switches.
If enabled, Camera Switch will use the front camera to see if you are
looking at the screen and to recognize your facial gestures. You may
also access Face Gesture Settings, including Open Mouth, Smile, Raise
Eyebrows, Look Left, Look Right, and Look Up.

Assign Switches

- Assign switches for scanning: tap to set switches and scanning preferences. You may also set the actions about how you interact with the phone.
- Assign switches to global actions: tap to assign global actions to switches.
- Assign switches to shortcuts: tap to group actions into a shortcut.

Menu Customization

- Enable Menu Customization: use the toggle switch to enable or disable menu customization feature on the Switch Access menu.
- Revert to Default Menu: tap to reset the Switch Access menu to default (when you tap on it, you will be asked once again whether you want to proceed).

Customize scanning

- Auto-scan: tap to enable/disable Auto-scan. If enabled, you may further set the Auto-scan time, Delay on first item, and Number of scans for scanning.
- Scanning method: tap to set Linear scanning (except keyboard), Rowcolumn scanning, or Group selection (advanced).
- Point scan: tap to enable/disable Point scan. If enabled, you may further set the Line speed, Delay on first item, Number of scans, Vertical scans, and Horizontal scans.
- Automatically start scanning: if enabled, scanning will star without
 pressing the switch. Use the toggle switch to enable or disable it.
- Auto-select: if enabled, this setting will automatically select the
 highlighted items. If an item cannot be selected, or if this setting is off,
 a menu of available actions will appear. Use the toggle switch to
 enable or disable it.

Display & sound

- Scanning highlight style: tap to select Highlight color and Highlight line style.
- Speech, sound & vibration: tap to set spoken and other feedback options.

Switch accommodation

- Ignore repeated presses: tap to enter a number for the time. When set, multiple switch presses within this set time period will be treated as one press.
- Release to perform action: if enabled, your phone will perform action
 when the connected switch is released. Use the toggle switch to
 enable or disable it.

Privacy policy: tap to be redirected to view Privacy policy by Google. **Developer settings**: tap to set Display speech output or Delete all shortcuts.



TalkBack

From the **Accessibility** screen, tap **TalkBack** to use the screen reader that speaks text and image content on your screen.



Use TalkBack: when using the toggle switch to enable Use TalkBack, a pop-up message will appear with some introductions and ask for your permission to allow it to have full control of your device. Tap **ALLOW** to enable or tap **DENY** to not enable it.

TalkBack shortcut: when using the toggle switch \(\bigcolon \) to enable Use
TalkBack, a pop-up message will appear with some introductions and ask for your permission to allow it to have full control of your device. Tap **ALLOW** to enable or tap **DENY** to not enable it.

Note: the first time you tap Use TalkBack or TalkBack shortcut, a greenoutlined introduction screen may appear and ask whether you want to turn on TalkBack accessibility feature.

Tips about using TalkBack

- Swipe left or right to move between items
- · Double-tap to activate an item
- Drag two fingers to scroll
- Press and hold both Volume keys (Volume up and Volume down) for a couple seconds to turn off

TalkBack Settings

From the ${\bf TalkBack}$ screen, tap ${\bf Settings}$ to enable or disable further options.

New features in TalkBack: tap to enter a tutorial of new TalkBack features.

Audio

- Text-to-speech settings: tap to enter settings for text-to-speech output, including Preferred engine (Google TTS), language, speech rate and pitch. You may use PLAY or RESET for simulation.
- Verbosity: tap to set verbosity. You may choose a preset option from High, Custom, to Low. There are other verbosity details that can be enabled or disabled, including keyboard echo, usage hints, list and grid information, element type, pitch changes and more.
- Sound and vibration: tap to enable or disable Vibration feedback, Audio ducking, and Sound feedback. You may set the Sound feedback volume if you have enabled Sound feedback.

Controls

- Customize Focus Indicator: tap to enable/disable Thick boarders or select your preferred color for focus indicator.
- Customize gesture: tap to customize gestures for navigating in TalkBack mode. You may enter Practice gestures for a tutorial or tap Reset gesture settings to default gestures. You may also change the functions for the single-finger and multi-finger gestures on this screen.

- Customize menus: tap to customize your TalkBack menu and reading controls.
- Braille keyboard: tap to set up braille keyboard, typing languages, and layout.
- Tutorial and help: tap to enter Tutorial, Practice gesture, and Help & feedback.
- Advanced settings: tap to set Speak Password, Custom lables, Element description order, Typing preference, Keyboard shortcut, and other information.
- Open TalkBack at the Play Store: open this feature on Google Play Store.



Text and display

From the **Accessibility** screen, tap **Text and display** to adjust text and display preferences.

- Font size: tap to to adjust your preferred font size. The screen features
 a nearly full page sample text and a slider near the bottom to adjust
 your font size. When you use the slider to adjust your font size, the
 sample text on the screen will change accordingly for your preview.
- Display size: tap to adjust your preferred display size. The screen
 features a sample instant-messaging image and a slider at the bottom
 to adjust the display size for your phone. Whenever you use the slider to
 adjust the display size, the sample instant messaging image will change
 its size accordingly for your preview.
- Bold text: use the toggle switch to enable or disable bold text.
- Color correction: tap to enter Color correction screen. Use the toggle switch to enable or disable Use color correction. You may choose a correction mode from Deuteranomaly, Protanomaly, Tritanomaly, to Grayscale. To enable Color correction shortcut with the toggle switch , choose to tap the Accessibility button first or hold both volume keys.
- Color inversion: tap to enter Color inversion screen. Use the toggle switch to enable or disable Use color inversion. If enabled, it will turn light screen into dark color, and turn dark screen into light color. To enable Color inversion shortcut with the toggle switch , choose to tap the Accessibility button first or hold both volume keys.
- Remove animations: use the toggle switch to enable or disable animation removal.
- Large mouse pointer: use the toggle switch to enable or disable large mouse pointer.
- High contrast text: use the toggle switch to enable or disable high contrast text.



Extra dim

From the **Accessibility** screen, use the toggle switch to enable or disable **Extra dim**, which makes the screen dimmer than the phone's minimum brightness.



From the Accessibility screen, tap Extra dim to access full settings.

- Make screen extra dim: use the toggle switch to enable or disable Make screen extra dim. If enabled, you may use the Intensity slider to adjust the screen to be dimmer or brighter.
- Keep on after device restarts: to enable this option with the toggle switch , you must have enabled Make screen extra dim.

Dark theme

From the **Accessibility** screen, use the toggle switch **to enable or disable Dark theme**, which makes the screen dark.



From the Accessibility screen, tap Dark theme to access full settings.

- Use Dark theme: use the toggle switch to enable or disable Use Dark theme. If enabled, the screen will turn dark.
- Schedule: tap to set None, Turns on at custom time, or Turns on from sunset to sunrise.

Magnification

From the **Accessibility** screen, tap **Magnification** to manage your screen zoom-in options.

- Magnification shortcut: to enable this option with the toggle switch
 , choose to tap the Accessibility button first or hold both volume keys.
- Magnification type: tap to set Magnify full screen, Magnify part of screen, or Switch between full and partial screen.



Timing controls

From the **Accessibility** screen, tap **Timing controls** to manage timing preferences.

- Touch & hold delay: tap to select Short, Medium, or Long
- Time to take action: choose the time period to show messages that remind you to take action, but messages are visible just temporarily. You may choose Default. 10 seconds. 30 seconds. 1 minute. or 2 minutes.
- Autoclick (dwell timing): if enabled, the mouse cursor will click automatically when the cursor stops moving for a preset period of time. Tap to set the time period as Off, Short (0.2 seconds), Medium (0.6 seconds), Long (1 second), or Custom (use a slider to set your own). Autoclick requires connection with a mouse.



System controls

From the **Accessibility** screen, tap **System controls** to set your system navigation preferences.

- System navigation: tap to set Gesture navigation (go Back, Home, and switch apps with swiping gestures) or 3-button navigation (use the 3 buttons at the bottom: Back, Home, and Recent). You may tap (3) to further set gesture options including sensitivity and how to invoke digital assistant app.
- Power button ends call: use the toggle switch to enable or disable this option.
- Auto-rotate screen: use the toggle switch to enable or disable
 Auto-rotate screen





Vibration & haptic strength

From the **Accessibility** screen, tap **Vibration & haptic strength** to set your preferences in Ring vibration, Notification vibration, and Touch feedback.

- Ring vibration: tap to turn Ring vibration on or off.
- Notification vibration: tap to turn Notification vibration on or off.
- Touch feedback: tap to turn Touch feedback on or off.



Caption preferences

From the **Accessibility** screen, tap **Caption preferences** to set your caption preferences.

- Show captions: use the toggle switch to enable or disable Show captions
- Caption size and style: tap to set Text size and Caption style. Available
 text sizes include Very small, Small, Default, Large, and Very large.
 Caption style include Set by app, White on black, Black on white, Yellow
 on black, Yellow on blue, and Custom.
- More options: tap to set the language for the caption.



Audio adjustment

From the **Accessibility** screen, tap **Audio adjustment** to adjust audio preferences.

- Mono audio: Mono audio combines channels when playing audio. Use the toggle switch to enable or disable it.
- Audio balance: use the slider to adjust audio balance.



Accessibility shortcuts

From the Accessibility screen, tap Accessibility shortcuts to set further accessibility options.

- Accessibility button: set the location, size and transparency for the
 Accessibility button. To get started, select an Accessibility feature,
 such as Select to Speak, Accessibility Menu, or TalkBack, to enable the
 shortcut and select the Accessibility button.
- Shortcut from lock screen: allow feature shortcut to turn on from the lock screen. Use the toggle switch to enable or disable it.





Text-to-speech output

From the Accessibility screen, tap Text-to-speech output to set Preferred engine (Google Text-to-Speech), language, speech rate or pitch. You may press PLAY or RESET for simulation.




From the **Settings** screen, tap **Security** to set phone protection features.

Security status

Security status displays preinstalled security applications by Google Android.

- Google Play Protect: tap to view the security status of Google Play Protect, which uses an intelligent scanning algorithm to scan harmful apps.
- Find My Device: tap to enable or disable Use Find My Device. If enabled, Find My Device will help you locate this phone remotely. Even if you lost this phone, this feature will help you keep your data safe. You must turn Location on to use this feature.
- Security update: tap to check if there is any security update.
- Google Play system update: tap to check if there is any system update.



Screen lock

From the Security screen, tap Screen lock to choose a screen lock method.

- None: no screen lock; simply swipe up to unlock the screen.
- Swipe: set screen lock by swipe.
- Pattern: tap to enter screen lock pattern. Draw a screen lock pattern first, and then re-draw to confirm.
- PIN: tap to enter PIN screen lock.
- Password: tap to enter password screen lock.



Fingerprint

From the **Security** screen, tap **Fingerprint** to choose a fingerprint screen lock as a backup screen lock method.

- Fingerprint + Pattern
- Fingerprint + PIN
- Fingerprint + Password



Smart lock

From the **Security** screen, tap **Smart Lock** to set Smart Lock. Note that you must have enabled a screen lock before using the Smart lock.

- On-body detection: keep your phone unlocked when it is on you. Use the toggle switch to enable or disable it.
- Trusted places: set a trusted place in Google Maps. Tap + Add trusted place to start.
- Trusted device: set a trusted device that is connected to your phone.
 When you unlock your phone, it stays unlocked when it is connected to the trusted device, like a paired Bluetooth wearable or car system. Tap + Add trusted device to start.

Device admin apps

From the **Security** screen, tap **Device admin apps** to view and activate the device admin app(s). Once activated, the admin app can erase data, change the screen lock, lock the screen or disable some screen lock features for your phone. Use the toggle switch to enable or disable it.



SIM card lock

From the **Security** screen, tap **SIM card lock** to set security measures for your inserted SIM card.

- Lock SIM card: enter a PIN to enable this feature.
- Change SIM PIN: tap it to change the PIN for SIM lock.



Encryption & credentials

From the **Security** screen, tap **Encryption & credentials** to view encryption status and set credential storage.

Encryption

Encrypt phone: encrypted

Credential storage

- Trusted credentials: tap it to view the list of trusted credentials
 preinstalled in the system or installed by the user.
- User credentials: tap it to view and modify stored credentials.
- Install a certificate: this feature allows you to install a certificate from SD card. Supported certificates include CA certificate, VPN & app user certificate, and Wi-Fi certificate.
- Clear credentials: remove all installed credentials.



App pinning

From the **Security** screen, tap **Use App pinning** to enable or disable app pinning. App pinning allows you to keep the current app in view until you unpin it. When app is pinned, personal data may be accessible (e.g. contacts or email contents), and pinned app may open other apps. It is strongly advised to enable this feature with people you trust.

Wireless & networks

From the **Security** screen, tap **Wireless & networks** to display security information about your carrier's network services.

Privacy

From the **Settings** screen, tap **Privacy** to manage your privacy preferences.

- Privacy dashboard: tap to view the privacy dashboard which apps are using permissions.
- Permission manager: manage and control the permissions for apps using your phone's functions, such as Phone, Contacts, Media, Location, Camera, Body sensors and more. When you tap on a function, you may allow or deny permission to some apps.
- Camera access: if enabled, camera access is available for apps and services. Use the toggle switch to enable or disable it.
- Microphone access: if enabled, microphone access is available for all apps and services. Use the toggle switch to enable or disable it.
- Show passwords: if enabled, this feature will display characters briefly
 as you type. Use the toggle switch to enable or disable it.
- Notifications on lock screen: tap to select Show all notification content or Don't show notifications at all.
- Show clipboard access: Show a message when apps access text, images, or other contents you have copied. Use the toggle switch to enable or disable it.
- Autofill service from Google: Android autofill service automatically fills
 out the form on the screen with saved personal information, such as
 names, passwords, card numbers, ID numbers, addresses and more.
 Use the toggle switch to enable or disable it.
- Google location history: tap to be redirected to Google Activity controls and view your location history saved in your Google account.
- Activity controls: tap to be redirected to Google Activity controls and you may view your activity history and set activity controls.
- Ads: tap to set your advertising ID and Opt out of Ads Personalization.
 - Usage & diagnostics: automatically sends device and app usage data and diagnostics to Google when this is enabled. Use the toggle switch
 to enable or disable it.



Location

From the **Settings** screen, tap **Location** to set Location services. You can see the apps that access this service.

- Use location: use the toggle switch to enable or disable Google location service.
- App location permissions: tap to view the apps with permission to access this device's location.
- Location services: tap to enable or disable Emergency Location Service, Google Location Accuracy, Google Location History, Google Location Sharing, Wi-Fi scanning or Bluetooth scanning.



Safety & emergency

From the **Settings** screen, tap **Safety & emergency** to set emergency information and SOS, as well as medical information.

- Emergency information: same as OPEN EMERGENCY INFORMATION.
- Emergency SOS: use the toggle switch to enable or disable Use
 Emergency SOS. You may also set countdown alarm and emergency calls numbers.
- Emergency Location Service: if enabled, your phone's location is sent to emergency response partners when you call an emergency number.
 Use the toggle switch to enable or disable Send ELS Location.
- Wireless emergency alerts: see Wireless emergency alerts in Notifications.



Passwords & accounts

From the **Settings** screen, tap **Passwords & accounts** to access

Password Manager of your Google account, set Autofill service or automatically synchronize app data.

Passwords

Tap to enter your Google account (Gmail account) and then select an account to access Password Manager.

Autofill service

Displays the services or apps enabled with Autofill. Tap 😵 to enable or disable **Use Autofill with Google** with the toggle switch (

Accounts

Displays all the Google accounts on this phone and tap an account to manage. You may tap the toggle switch of **Automatically sync app data** to let apps refresh data automatically.

Automatically sync app data: this features lets apps refresh data automatically. Use the toggle switch () to enable or disable it.



Digital Wellbeing & parental controls

From the **Settings** screen, tap **Digital Wellbeing & parental controls** to use the tools and features for digital wellbeing and parental controls.



Dashboard

From the **Digital Wellbeing & parental controls** screen, tap **Dashboard** to view the phone usage times, and you may tap ** to view by Screen time, Notification received, or Times opened. Tap ** to ** Set timers for your apps. When the app timer ends, the app will be paused for the rest of the day.



Bedtime mode


From the **Digital Wellbeing & parental controls** screen, tap **Bedtime mode** to silence your phone and change the screen to black and white at bedtime. Only alarms and important calls can reach you.

Turn on Bedtime mode

- Based on schedule: tap to set the schedule for your bedtime mode.
 - While charging at bedtime: tap to set the Before and After time
- Off

Customize: tap Customize and use the the toggle switch to enable or disable the following

- Do Not Disturb for Bedtime mode: only calls from starred contacts, repeat callers, and alarms can reach you.
- Grayscale: change the screen to black and white.
 - Keep the screen dark: turn off always-on display at bedtime.
- Turn off Bedtime mode at next alarm: if no alarm is set, Bedtime mode will turn off at the scheduled time.



Focus mode

From the **Digital Wellbeing & parental controls** screen, tap **Focus mode** to select distracting apps to pause them.

To enable Focus mode

- 1. Select the app you want to pause.
- 2. Tap TURN ON NOW or Set a schedule.



Manage notifications

From the Digital Wellbeing & parental controls screen, tap Manage notifications to use the the toggle switch to enable or disable notifications for selected apps. Tap MOST RECENT to sort the app list by MOST RECENT. MOST FREQUENT. ALL APPS, and TURNED OFF.



Do Not Disturb

From the **Digital Wellbeing & parental controls** screen, tap **Do Not Disturb** to access full setting options for Do Not Disturb. For details, refer to **Do Not Disturb** in **Notifications** under **Settings**.

Heads Up

From the **Digital Wellbeing & parental controls** screen, tap **Heads Up** to set up this digital wellbeing feature. Then tap **Next** to set your preferences.

- Physical activity: this lets Heads Up know when you are walking.
- Location (optional): This lets Heads Up know when you are outdoors. If you select this option, you will have to allow Digital Wellbeing to access this device's location and then set the location permission.





Parental controls

From the **Digital Wellbeing & parental controls** screen, tap **Set up parental controls** to set content restrictions and other limits to balance screen time and phone usage. Tap **Get started** to begin.



From the Who will be using this device screen, select Child or teen or Parent.

- Child or teen: if you select Child or teen, you will be guided to set links to your child's Google account, choose apps for this phone, set app filter, and set bedtime and screen time limits.
- Parent: if you select Parent, you will be guided to set up Family Link app to remotely supervise your child's Android devices.



Google

From the **Settings** screen, tap **Google** to set services and manage preferences for your Google account.

- Ads: tap to set your advertising ID and Opt out of Ads Personalization.
- Autofill: tap to enable/disable Autofill with Google and set SMS verification codes for Autofill service and default browser.
- Backup: tap to access and manage your account storage and enable/ disable Backup by Google One.
- Devices & sharing: tap to enter sub-menu to access Cast options, Chromebook, Devices, Nearby connections and Nearby Share.

- Find My Device: tap to enabe or disable Find My Device (Google Location service must have been activated first)
- Mobile data & messaging: tap to access Data management and Device phone number.
- Parent controls: enter Parental controls. For instructions, refer to Parental controls in Digital Wellbeing & parental controls under Settings.

 Parental controls and parental data, this late Google appeaus an device.
- Personalize using shared data: this lets Google apps use on-device data shared by these apps and other sources. Use the the toggle switch to enable or disable the selected app(s).
- Set up & restore: tap to access Restore contacts, Set up nearby device, and Set up your work profile.
- Settings for Google apps: tap to access Connected apps, Google Contacts sync, Google Fit, Google Play Instant, Google Pay, or Search, Assistant & Voice.

From the **Settings** screen, tap **System** to manage detailed settings of

your phone.



Languages & input

From the **System** screen, tap **Languages & input** to set keyboard and text inputs.

Languages: tap to show the default display language of your phone.

Tap + Add a language to select and add another language.

Press and hold on the selected language to change its position.

Keyboards

- On-screen keyboard: tap to set your Gboard, Google Voice Typing
 and more. For detailed instructions about Gboard, refer to Text input
 on Gboard in Basic Operations. Tap Google Voice Typing to enable or
 disable Block offensive words or set default language for voice typing.
- Physical keyboard: tap to set up if your phone is connected with a
 physical keyboard. Use the the toggle switch to enable or disable
 Use on-screen keyboard when physical keyboard is active. Tap
 Keyboard shortcuts to display available keyboard shortcuts.

Tools

- Spell checker: tap to enable or disable spell checker.
- Personal dictionary: add words to be used for quick-typing in apps.

With this profile, device information such as manufacturer, product ID, and product version may be identified. This profile provides the needed information for driver download/upgrade, as well as the needs for plug-and-play applications.
MAP (Message Access Profile)	This profile is used to exchange messages between devices. It is especially tailored for the automotive hands free where an onboard terminal device (typically a Car-Kit installed in the car) takes advantage of the messaging capability of a communication device (typically a mobile phone).
